Lane Casadonte joined WTVR as a news photographer in 1994. He spent three years as weekend sports anchor before becoming the sports director in May of 1998.

In 2014, Mr. Casadonte was honored with both regional and national Edward R. Murrow awards for sports reporting for his profile of Kevin Grayson. He was also nominated for a regional Emmy award. He has been named Virginia Sportscaster of the year 3 times, and been honored by Richmond Magazine as their readers' favorite local sportscaster 4 times. Since his promotion to sports director, the CBS 6 Sports Department has been honored by the Associated Press, Virginia Association of Broadcasters, and National Sportscasters and Sportswriters Association 15 different times.

Mr. Casadonte is one of the voters for the Dudley Award, handed out to Virginia's best college football player. He is also on the vot-

ing panel for the John Wooden Award, given to the player of the year in college basketball. He is a member of the NSSA as well as the Atlantic Coast Sports Media Association, which hands out All-ACC honors each year.

Originally from upstate NY, Mr. Casadonte graduated from Plattsburgh St. University and worked as a sports anchor and photographer at WUTR in Utica, NY before heading south. He is a die hard (and realistic) NY Yankees and Pittsburgh Steelers fan. He enjoys running and golf and is married to former CBS 6 anchor Deborah Cox. They have two children, Connor and Mary Catherine.

Michael W. Smith to receive Bar's Professionalism Award at luncheon

the VSB was under intense scrutiny and political pressure. As a leader in the ACTL, he headed a study focused on the vanishing jury trial that has had national consequences, and helped lead a group focused on the training of federal district judges. As the ACTL's current President, he is working with its leadership to help define the contours of trial practice as the practice itself changes and as the population of lawyers becomes increasingly diverse.

As colleagues of Mike's, we have had the opportunity to observe a trait



that is not as "public" as the matters discussed above, but equally important. Mike is a teacher, mentor and trusted advisor to attorneys not only within his firm, but around the country. With regularity, professional colleagues with a range of questions, concerns or worries call Mike to help them work through knotty problems, professional or personal. In complete confidence, with no fanfare, and with no thought of compensation, Mike simply provides a trusted presence not only to friends, but to former adversaries who have come to respect him. He is a "lawyers' lawyer."
