## Pro Bono Housing Law Training set for December 7th

Join us for the Pro Bono Housing Law Training, co-sponsored by the Richmond Bar Association and the Housing Justice Program (comprised of CVLAS, LAJC, and VPLC), on Tuesday, December 7, 2021 from 3:00–5:30 p.m., by live webinar. The training will consist of sessions on landlord/tenant law (evictions, repairs, security deposits), Fair Housing, and some Virginia court procedure. It is anticipated that the program will be approved for 2.5 hours of live, interactive MCLE credit. Register in advance for this training: <https://tinyurl.com/probonohousingtraining>.

If you participate in this training, it is expected that you will sign up for a one year pro bono commitment for year 2022 with one of the 3 participating Richmond area legal aid organizations.

- Legal Aid Justice Center's Pro Bono Housing Unit commitment consists of volunteering for at least four 1.5 hour appointment slots throughout the year, in which you will advise approximately 3-5 clients per session and offer further representation where necessary. Currently the housing unit has been operating by telephone until it is considered safe to meet clients in person, but occasionally pro bono attorneys may appear in court if defending against evictions.

- Central Virginia Legal Aid's Pro Bono Triage program pairs pro bono attorneys with 2 or 3 security deposit recovery and/or housing repair cases in a year. Each case may be resolved generally with between 2 and 15 hours and with as little as a demand letter or as much as a general district court trial. Cases are available via the [www.Justice-Server.org](http://www.Justice-Server.org) portal. Our Triage Champions assist in recruiting, mentoring and training.

- Virginia Poverty Law Center's Eviction Legal Helpline: Volunteer attorneys who help with giving legal advice are the key that allows the Eviction Legal Helpline to serve as many of our neighbors as possible. The time commitment is modest, scheduling shifts is easy and flexible, and all work is done remotely from any place with a phone, an internet connection, and adequate privacy. The Helpline provides excellent training and reference materials as well as on-call support. To access the training materials and sign up for shifts, visit <https://evictionhelpline.org/>.

The lawyer nominating Mr. Anderson writes, "John's legacy is one of warmth and kindness displayed to all he encountered, and professionalism at the very highest level in all his endeavors. John simply loved practicing law. He was a true gentleman, a scholar of the law and a trusted counselor who treated everyone -- clients, opposing counsel, the judiciary and staff -- with equal dignity, civility and respect."

Lindsey A. Strachen is the recipient of the Bar's Young Lawyer of the Year Award. The Award is presented annually to a member of the Bar's Young Lawyers Section who has excelled in the practice of law to date and who has shown the potential to become a leader in the legal profession.

A Senior Associate at IslerDare P.C., Ms. Strachen represents employers in state and federal court and advises clients on a variety of labor and employment matters including those arising under Title VII, ADEA, ADA, FMLA, FLSA and state wage and hour laws. She also has experience in complex litigation and class action litigation matters. Before joining Isler Dare in 2019, Ms. Strachen practiced with Jackson Lewis. She graduated from the University of Richmond School of Law in 2012 where she served as the Executive Editor for the Richmond Journal of Law and Technology and as a member of the Moot Court Board.

A former member of the RBA's Young Lawyers Section Executive Committee, Ms. Strachen is an active member of the Metro Richmond Women's Bar Association, a board member of the VBA Labor and

Employment committee, and has authored multiple publications on various topics both regarding labor and employment and on working as a young lawyer.

"Lindsey has a unique way of facing challenges that may come her way in the practice of law. She is solution-oriented and can always be counted on to bring creative problem solving ideas and techniques to the table," writes the lawyer nominating her. "Lindsey serves as an important mentor to our younger associates and is always willing to learn and implement new practice standards to help with the constant evolution of practicing law. Her calm and professional demeanor affords her the ability to deal with the most difficult situations and provide positive outcomes for clients."

The John C. Kenny Pro Bono Award is presented annually to an individual or law firm that demonstrates a dedication to furthering the delivery of pro bono legal services to the poor and under-served in the Richmond Metro area. This year, Lindsay Pickral and Carolyn White from ThompsonMcMullan, PC. will be recognized for their work with the Medical-Legal Partnership at VCU Health, a hospital-based legal services program that embeds lawyers in their clinics to work as part of the health care team. The Partnership relies heavily on the pro bono legal community to handle cases that may fall outside the scope and eligibility criteria for legal aid.

A Director at ThompsonMcMullan, Carolyn White's practice focuses on estate planning, probate and administration of trusts and wills, long-term care planning, and elder law. She is certified by the Virginia Supreme

Court to serve as guardian ad litem for incapacitated adults. She is also a member of the National Academy of Elder Law Attorneys.

Before joining the firm, she was previously was one-half of White & McCarthy (along with director Chris McCarthy), which folded into ThompsonMcMullan in 2018. She holds a J.D. from the University of Richmond School of Law.

An Associate at ThompsonMcMullan, Lindsay Pickral concentrates on estate planning, estate and trust administration, long-term care planning, and guardianship and conservatorship. She has a special emphasis on special-needs clients and disability planning, offering guidance and access to families and caregivers who are often managing complex healthcare conditions.

Ms. Pickral is a magna cum laude graduate of the University of Richmond School of Law, where she served as president of the McNeill Law Society and as annual survey editor of the Law Review.

The individual nominating the duo writes, "Lindsay and Carolyn have become our go-to pro bono attorneys, particularly for guardianship. We receive a lot of requests from our providers on behalf of patients who are transitioning to adulthood and do not have the capacity, due to complex medical and mental health conditions, to manage their healthcare and finances when they turn 18. Lindsay and Carolyn handle these guardianship cases for our patients and families with kindness and compassion. I know I can always count on Lindsay and Carolyn to help - they have never said no!"




### Bankruptcy Section golf tournament set for October; luncheon/CLE in November
